

2021-2022 Activities

NH Jump\$tart was not immune to the disruption caused by Covid-19. The impact of the pandemic began in the Spring of 2020 and continued through the first half of the 2021 academic year.

As a result, we were forced to suspend the in-person classroom presentations of our **I Can Save!** Program. However, we were pleased to resume and conduct the State Final of our **FinLit300** high school competition; the annual **Classroom Connections** teacher workshop; and our fund-raising **Golf Tournament**.

We also released the [2021 Survey of New Hampshire High Schools](#) detailing that 10 high schools in the Granite State that now require a standalone course in personal finance for graduation in their district.

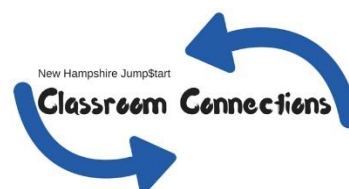
Another important development was the passage of HB 1671 which includes personal finance as a core academic requirement under the NH state definition of an “adequate education” beginning with the 2023-2024 academic year.

Here are the results of our other activities:



- Over **450** students from **14** schools participated in the online portion of the [FinLit300](#) tournament with the teams from **Moultonborough Academy** and **Merrimack High School** finishing 1st and 2nd, respectively.

- **75** teachers registered to attend the May [Classroom Connections](#) workshop before it was cancelled.



- **116** players participated in our annual charity golf tournament in August which successfully kicked off our fund-raising efforts for the upcoming year.

We look forward to resuming all of these activities beginning again during the 2022-2023 academic year.
