2022-2023 Activities

NH Jump\$tart was not immune to the disruption caused by Covid-19 but thankfully, our activities and programs resumed in the 2022-2023 academic year.

Another significant development during this time period was the passage of HB 1671 which includes personal finance as a core academic requirement under the NH state definition of an "adequate education" beginning with the 2023-2024 academic year.

We will be releasing our updated <u>Survey of New Hampshire High</u> <u>Schools</u> during the coming months which should show significant improvement in the teaching of personal finance in our New Hampshire high schools.

Here are the results of our other activities:

• We met with over **500** second grade students from **15** elementary schools with our <u>I Can Save</u> program which focuses on needs and wants with an emphasis on saving, spending, and sharing.
